**BINGO would like to provide the community an update on recent works and developments at our Eastern Creek Recycling Ecology Park (REP).**

At BINGO, we recycle large volumes of waste annually from the communities we serve, delivering services to over 20,000 customers in NSW, VIC and QLD. Over the last five years, we have invested almost \$1 billion in NSW in recycling assets and infrastructure.

The Eastern Creek REP is one of the most advanced waste recycling facilities in Australia.

### Permanent flares are now operational

After more than 12 months of planning, design, and construction, the two permanent flares at BINGO's Eastern Creek Recycling Ecology Park (REP) have been certified and operational since 23 December 2022. The flares are designed with a methane destruction efficiency greater than 99% which helps lower emissions and improves environmental outcomes for the Eastern Creek site and the local community.

### Update on Throughput Increase Development Proposal - indicative timelines for response to public exhibition submissions.

BINGO is currently progressing a State Significant Development Application to optimise the capacity of our new advanced recycling centre, Material Processing Centre 2 (MPC 2) by constructing new internal roads and a new site exit to Honeycomb Drive, for improved operational efficiency to support an increase in recycling throughput.

### The proposal seeks to:



Increase current recycling throughput by 950,000 tonnes per annum



Build new ancillary structures including maintenance sheds and hardstands for materials handling



Optimise the internal road network and create improved access and egress from the REP



Improve stormwater outcomes across the REP

Building on BINGO's existing waste management activities at the Eastern Creek REP, the proposal will be an important part of BINGO's continued investment in Western Sydney. The project will create more than 40 jobs during construction and an additional 70 jobs once operational. It will drive economic growth and support Australia's transition to a sustainable circular economy.

BINGO's Recycling Infrastructure Optimisation Project went on public exhibition from 14 July to 10 August 2022. A total of 94 submissions were received, comprising 84 community submissions and 10 agency submissions.

Based on the submissions and feedback received from stakeholders, we have made a number of refinements to the Proposal including removal of the Kangaroo Avenue exit in the north-east of the Proposal site, upscaling the stormwater management system to provide improved quantity and quality outcomes, inclusion of additional dust management measures, removal of the southern landfill access road and inclusion of a new internal access road to the maintenance and manufacturing building.

Response to submissions report, including responses to all comments made on the Proposal and a detailed description of Proposal refinements, is scheduled for submission to the Department of Planning and Environment in March 2023.



### Other active development proposals

#### Western Operational Area (Modification 9) -

This Proposal seeks to relocate and enclose existing approved recycling activities within two new fully enclosed facilities in the Western Operational Area. The Proposal would also include upgraded stormwater infrastructure to improve quality and quantity outcomes across the REP. It is anticipated that the modification application will be submitted to the Department of Planning and Environment before June 2023.
