Patons Lane Resource Recovery Centre Gets Underway

The development of a Resource Recovery Centre at Patons Lane in Orchard Hills will get underway in May. Bingo Industries, a leading Australian waste management and recycling company, purchased the site late last year.

The development, originally approved in 2012, has been the subject of extensive environmental studies and project planning since 2015. With all the management plans in place the project is now ready to start.

“It will take about 15 months to prepare the site and build the recycling facility, which is expected to commence operations in July 2019,” says David Taylor, Head of Project Development for Bingo Industries.

“Our first priority is to keep the community up to date with the latest information about the development. This week we are letterboxing homes in nearby areas to encourage residents to connect with the project via the website and our Facebook page. We are keen for the community to know what they can expect as we develop this facility.

“The first activities will include installing a sound and dust monitoring system and erecting site sheds. Residents nearby may be aware of increased activity on the site as earthmoving equipment moves in to create access roads for the dewatering program, construct the spillway and dam and prepare the base for the main building. We have engaged Mulgoa Quarries as the local contractor to do the earthworks.” Mr Taylor explained.

Once complete, the Bingo Industries Resource Recovery Centre at Patons Lane will process building and demolition waste. It is not for domestic waste and it will not accept any hazardous or putrescible (food) waste.
